09.10 Prime times – Sleep and rest time

Sleep and rest times are key times in the day for being close and promoting security. Younger children will need to sleep but older children do not usually need to. No child is made to sleep.

Children over 2yrs old

- Children sleep on rest mats and have their own personalised bedding.
- Nappies changed and heavier clothing removed.
- A separate area is closed off from other children.
- Children are settled by their key person if possible and comforted to sleep. Key persons may gently stroke or pat children.
- If children fall asleep in-situ it may be necessary to move or wake them to make sure they are comfortable, they are not left to sleep in a bean bag or chair.
- Sleeping children are regularly checked at least every ten minutes and are within sight and/or hearing of staff
